In Chapter 5 of Matthew's Gospel, we hear Jesus telling his disciples: "You are the light of the world. A city built on a hill cannot be hid. No one after lighting a lamp puts it under the bushel basket, but on the lampstand, and it gives light to all in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father in heaven."

The Why of The Lighthouse

In my younger years as a Catholic, I did not know what it meant to be a disciple. I heard the words said by our priests and church leaders, and thought it was equivalent to being a follower of Jesus, someone who goes to church, or someone who “believes.” Little did I know that there is so much more to life than this. And even the Christian life!

As a young adult, I was faith-filled and was blessed to have a vibrant youth and young adult ministry community — both at the parish and through diocesan ministry. But there was still something missing. Even as I served in youth ministry at my parish, I thought that being a disciple was being Catholic — having a faith and believing in Jesus and going to church — and that evangelization was the work of the “professionals” (priests, clergy, staff, missionaries).

I quickly learned that as a Catholic, I have a responsibility to be a disciple — to follow Jesus and respond to his command to make disciples of all nations (cf. Matthew 28). I also learned that evangelization is more than just preaching on a street corner, or mere action (living out the Christian faith and being a good person, serving others, etc.). Evangelization is the sharing of the message of the Gospel — that God loves us, he died for us to redeem and reconcile our relationship with the Father. It requires action and words. It can be simplified to sharing how my encounter with Jesus has transformed my life; how I have experienced Him and his love for me. How can I not share such good news!


How can I not share such good news!

That's what *The Lighthouse* is: our response to Jesus' invitation and command to make disciples of all nations — **to be disciple-making disciples**.

We want to help others see the Light of Christ. We want to be a lighthouse on a dark sea and lead souls to the safety of Jesus, the Light¹.

Often we hear the ‘fears’ of evangelization: the fear of judgement, fear of not knowing enough, fear of rejection. These are all very valid fears and excuses why we don’t evangelize. I am here to tell you that I experienced these fears too! But I now know that it is not I that is the agent of evangelization. It is through the power of the Holy Spirit and the will of the Father, that I am able to evangelize — to share the Good News of the love of Jesus and his redemption for us.

Let us help you; equip and support you for the Mission: to be disciple-making disciples, who have Jesus at the center of everything you believe, say, and do².

Under the leadership and dedication of Fr. Thom, the Lighthouse has continued to grow. All of us sitting in the pews are called to action through living the five Lighthouse Living (core) values of becoming Warm-Hearted, Scripture-Soaked, Spirit-Reliant, Repentant, and Beacons of Hope.

By living these simple values:

- We are emboldened to reach beyond our walls to those who do not know of the love, mercy and compassion of Jesus, and endeavour to bring them into a personal relationship with Him.
- We are encouraged to reach out to those who have become lukewarm and fallen away from the faith (many in our own families).
- We support each other, wherever we are, on our own faith journeys.

Every baptized person is called to respond to God's presence within them by utilizing the unique gifts we have been blessed with. When I was asked to coordinate *The Lighthouse* (formation process) in 2021, I knew we were embarking on an adventure. I felt drawn by the Holy Spirit to give it my all, and I can only say that the experience has been transformational for me.

I have learned to step out of my comfort zone to invite, welcome and lead our Lighthouse formation process as our groups have grown from one to four. With Jesus at the center of my life, the five values have become a natural part of my daily living and I try to live them as best I can. When I am tired and feel I have nothing more to give, I think of the Lighthouse, what it means to me and what it can mean to others. Then, together with the Holy Spirit, I carry on joyfully.

Our Family of Parishes comprises many different, rich ethnicities and cultures. Lighthouse belongs to all! It is who we are to others; how we relate to others; it is for all those in ministries and those who are not part of any ministry.

The brightness of the light that shines forth depends on us, the parishioners. How well do we 'do' Lighthouse Living? If we share our love of Jesus with others, we will accomplish our life-giving mission and call to become disciple-making disciples.

Many hands make light work. All these many hands coming together make the light of our Lighthouse burn ceaselessly, strongly, and more boldly and brightly with each passing day.

How do we do that? Are we an invitational community? Do we have Jesus at the center of our lives? Are we disciples bringing others to know and love Jesus?

Perhaps you've noticed the large Lighthouse banner hanging on the wall in the narthex? I encourage you to read it.

The Where of The Lighthouse

When I was invited to join the Lighthouse initiative five years ago, I hesitantly responded with a 'yes', as I didn't think I needed another program to get closer to God. I already had a personal relationship with Jesus. Many years ago I decided to follow Jesus and since then with the power of the Holy Spirit my life has changed (from head to heart).

However **Lighthouse Living** has taught me that I had not fully responded to God's invitation to mission. I needed to intentionally respond to Christ's mission. I have shared my story with others many times, but I had not intentionally gone out as a disciple to make disciples. He has called us to be "fishers of men" (cf. Matthew 4.19) and to "go make disciples." (cf. Matthew 28.20)

Lighthouse living is not a program, it's a way of life. I have intentionally decided to not only know Jesus, but have given him permission to change me. It's tough sometimes, and the old self leads me down the easy road. So I fall, but have learned to get up because He is merciful. As we take the first step, the Holy Spirit will guide and carry us through. During our discipleship formation, I received a better understanding of my Catholic faith through the study and deep discussions we had at our tables. Listening to others' stories attentively, before sharing our own is important when reaching out to others.

Volunteers offer their time and service according to when it is convenient. Serving in any ministry has taken on a new meaning. As a disciple of Jesus, I serve God because of what He has done and does for me! In church or outside I try to focus on others and share God's love, as He gives me the grace to do so.

In our Family of Parishes, we have seen lives transformed, a joy among our parishioners that is warm and contagious. Some have shared that they have experienced profound freedom as they have relied on the Holy Spirit in their lives. Others have said, even though their lives have been messed up, they have found forgiveness through **repentance**.

You will feel the warmth and love of God, as you enter and leave our parish. After our New Year's Eve Mass, one of our team members from hospitality brushed off the snow from all the cars parked in the reduced-mobility parking spots. That is being **warm-hearted**.

Every group/ministry meeting starts with *Lectio Divina* (divine reading - praying and reflecting on Scripture). We are learning to not only study the Bible but to permit God's Word to soak us. One can find Bibles in every meeting room in our two parishes. Our Life Groups have grown as people appreciate you can get lost in a large parish and feel the need for small groups to form relationships, pray, learn and grow in their faith. They share their stories offering hope to each other.

The How of The Lighthouse

When we think of a lighthouse, it is likely standing tall on a rocky shore — steadfast, shining through fog, wind and darkness. It doesn't move with the waves; it is firmly anchored and shines so others may find their way. Now, consider how that steady light is focused through the lenses of glass and provides guidance in good and bad times.

Some three years ago, we began a journey, a process of Lighthouse Living and we were commissioned last Pentecost as "disciple-making disciples." The process of using the Catholic Christian Outreach (CCO) faith study books was long: more than two years, with five faith studies, titled: *Discovery, Source, Growth, Trust, and Commission*.

The faith studies and gatherings are spread out in a way that can fit many lifestyles and meant for all adult parishioners. It may seem a large commitment, and it is, but it's also an investment in yourself, your faith journey and your faith enrichment that rewards you and impacts those around you as you live out the Core Values and nurture faith in others.

For us the time spent has been very fruitful and life-changing. As a couple we engage freely in discussions of many varied faith topics, share online tips and resources and have an enhanced prayer and faith life as a couple as well as individually.

Lighthouse Living to us is living a life that reflects the light of Christ, guiding others safely toward Him through our love, faith, and daily actions.

The lens of Lighthouse Living lets you see the good, those in need and brings you oh so close to the Holy Spirit that sometimes you are just aglow from the energy. Living with Lighthouse Living —living out the Core Values— each day brings a positive and beautiful light to our world. Even our troubles are eased by the trust established through the Core Values: **Warm-Hearted, Beacons of Hope, Spirit-Reliant, Scripture-Soaked, and Repentant.**

All with "Jesus at the center of everything we do and say."¹

Warm-Hearted: Shining with Compassion

A lighthouse shines for everyone — the lost, the struggling, the weary.

To be Warm-Hearted means to live with compassion, kindness and empathy. It's about reflecting the heart of Jesus by noticing people, listening and loving without conditions.

Practical ways that we live Warm-Hearted:

- Offer a kind word or prayer for someone in need
- Lead with grace rather than judgment
- Being present — your warmth might be the only light someone sees that day

Spirit-Reliant: Fueled by the Holy Spirit

A lighthouse cannot shine without oil in its lamp or power to its light.

Our fuel is the Holy Spirit — our guide, comforter and strength.

Being Spirit-Reliant means surrendering our will to God's will, listening for His voice and allowing the Spirit to empower us daily.

We practise Spirit-Reliance by:

- Starting each day in prayer, asking the Spirit to lead our steps
- Being sensitive to prompts to serve, speak, or wait
- Trusting God's timing, even when it differs from our own



Scripture Soaked: Anchored in Truth

A lighthouse is built on solid rock — it must not shift with the tides.
For us, that rock is God's Word.

To be Scripture-Soaked is to let the Word shape our thinking, language and decisions.

Becoming Scripture Soaked we:

- Read and meditate on Scripture routinely
- Let Bible truths influence our responses, not just our opinions
- Share verses that have shaped our journey — let others see how the Word transforms us

Repentant: Keeping the Light Bright

When the glass of a lighthouse becomes foggy or dirty, the light can't shine clearly. In the same way, we know that sin and pride can dim our ability to reflect God's light.

Repentance means continually realigning ourselves with God — not out of guilt, but out of love and humility.

Living Repentantly we:

- Invite God to reveal areas that need change
- Confess, turn and walk in renewed grace
- Remember — repentance restores clarity, it is not condemnation

Beacon of Hope: Guiding Through Darkness

The purpose of a lighthouse is to offer direction and hope when the night seems overwhelming.

We, too, are called to be Beacons of Hope — pointing others toward Jesus even when things seem to be so overwhelming.

To be a Beacon of Hope, we:

- Speak words that uplift rather than discourage
- Share testimonies of God's faithfulness
- Live with joy and peace that we hope can draw others toward the source of hope — Christ — guiding them safely to the shore of His presence.

Jesus is at the Center: He is The True Light

All these values exist because of Jesus — the Light of our World.

Without Him, our lighthouse is dark and powerless. With Him at the center, everything aligns: our purpose, our peace, and our witness.

With Jesus is at the center of our lives we find:

- Love flows naturally
- Hope never fades
- Our light is steady and true, no matter the storm

Keep the Light Shining

To live out Lighthouse Living we have chosen to:

- Stay close to the Source of Light
- Reflect His love to others
- Recognize and treasure "God" moments, just finally seeing those moments is a blessing indeed
- Keep our lamps trimmed and burning

Our journey did not end at the commissioning (Pentecost 2025); we have the opportunity to work within our parish community in several ministries along with the Lighthouse Disciple-making Formation Process, but also we were led through a process to discern on charisms². Through that discernment, we understand more clearly how and why God brought us together first as a young couple in love, to marriage and raising our children, caring for sick and elderly parents, sharing a business together for more than 30 years and all the time being so much in love and trust of each other. Our charisms are not shared but dovetail to make our life together so much more complete.

Please consider the Lighthouse and Lighthouse Living. Let your life be the lighthouse through which others see the love, truth, and grace of Jesus — guiding them safely to the shore of His presence. 

INTERPRETIVE KEY TO OUR FAMILY OF PARISHES LOGO

The cosmic Christ shines throughout the universe to every land and to every person.

The gold band reminds us of our 'Communion in Christ' embracing Saint Patrick & Holy Family Parishes. It also speaks to us of the gift of the Eucharist.

Symbols of Jesus as the Alpha and Omega, the Beginning and End of all, sit on top of the Lighthouse.

Turbulent seas surround the base of the Lighthouse, never to be overcome by them.

The stripes on the Lighthouse refer to the formation path of disciples – up toward Christ. The path equips the saints for ministry.

The base of the Lighthouse is open. Everyone is invited to enter on the path of encounter and formation as disciples.

Jesus is the light of the world, reaching out first to those who have not yet encountered Jesus Christ; second, to those whose Christian faith has grown cold or who are lost; and finally, to those who struggle to live faith wholeheartedly.

Jesus is our Light, our Lighthouse.
